
Thanks to our visiting teams from Warilla Sporties, Kiama, Robbo, Gymea, Alexandria, and HC Bowlers for their support.

THE GAME OF BOWLS – ANCIENT BEGINNINGS (PART 2)

As the British Empire spread so too Lawn Bowls. In the new territories the game started in USA, Canada, New Zealand and Australia. The first game in Australia was played in 1844 at the Bowling Green Hotel in Sandy Bay, Tasmania. Bowls had spread rapidly in Britain and the new territories when Edwin Buddy invented the lawnmower in 1830.

In 1852, 1000 paying spectators watched a match at Sandy Bay between Civilians and the Military.

In 1860, bowling clubs were formed in Melbourne. In 1880's, The NSW Lawn Bowls Association was formed with clubs beginning at Parramatta, Williamstown, Strathfield, Belmore and Newcastle. At the turn of the Century clubs formed at Woonona, Corrimal, Moss Vale and continued to spread on the South Coast.

There are 46 countries across 6 continents that are now members of the World Bowls Federation.

If they do not, the Controlling Body may escort the offender away from the area immediately surrounding the green.
